Policy Statement:

If a waitlist is necessary for access to services, applicants who meet the eligibility criteria (please see Appendix A) will be offered a place on the waitlist. Services are offered to clients on the waitlist as soon as they become available.

Purpose:

To ensure that access to service is provided fairly, based on need and eligibility for services within the available provincial and federal funding.

Procedures:

- 1. If a waitlist for services is required for any reason, clients and caregivers are notified as soon as possible. If necessary, they may also be directed to other alternatives while maintaining a space on the waitlist.
- 2. Clients on the waitlist are given priority based on:
 - the level of risk they are experiencing at home.
 - whether they are isolated or living alone without family or other supports
 - the amount of stress their caregivers are experiencing.
 - the level of need for services (based on case by case assessment)
- 3. The Community Health Nurse maintains regular contact with the client or caregiver to assess any changes in waitlist priority and to offer reassurance.
- 4. Clients or caregivers will be contacted as soon as services become available.

Appendix A - The eligible recipients for this program:

- Who have undergone a formal assessment of their continuing care service needs and have been assessed to require one or more of the essential services; AND
- Require services which can be provided with reasonable safety to the client and caregiver, within established standards, policies and regulations for service practice; AND
- Require services that can be provided within current 9-5, Monday to Friday guidelines.

Out of province visitors

First Nations and Inuit of any age visiting Ontario from another province/territory and persons who are in Canada without landed immigrant status may be eligible for home care services essential to enable them to travel home up to a maximum of 60 days under the following conditions:

- The individual is residing on reserve; AND
- The individual does not have private health/travel insurance and/or the home province will not cover the cost; AND
- Family/friends cannot reasonably provide for or make provision for the individual's care or there are no family/friends available to provide for or make provision for the individual's care; AND
- The care required is most appropriately provided in the home.

Eligibility exclusions

- Community members who require a level of service not provided through the FNIHCC Program
- The services, based on assessed needs, cannot be provided with reasonable assurance of safety of the client, the caregiver, and the staff.
